During the month of August, the public works replaced four driveway culverts, one each on Browns Lane, North Union Rd, Butler Rd, and Come Spring Ln, as well as some ditching on Come Spring. We also changed a four-foot cross culvert on Butler Rd that was completely rotten. The culvert was 45' long and required us to shut the road down for the day. From start to finish we were done in seven hours. The crew did an excellent job.

Other projects included grading Bump Hill and the first half of Butler Rd as they were pretty rough and couldn't really wait until the fall time. We are also back in the mowing cycle again now that we have received some much-needed rain. Its nice to see green grass again. Also, during the month of August, several roads including Coggins Hill, Townsend, Overlock Hill, Pound Hill and Bump Hill, were chip sealed by All States.

And finally, crew member Corey Witham passed his CDL exam and is now a fully licensed class B driver and told me he's looking forward to getting the first snowstorm under his belt. (I can guarantee he's the only one!)
