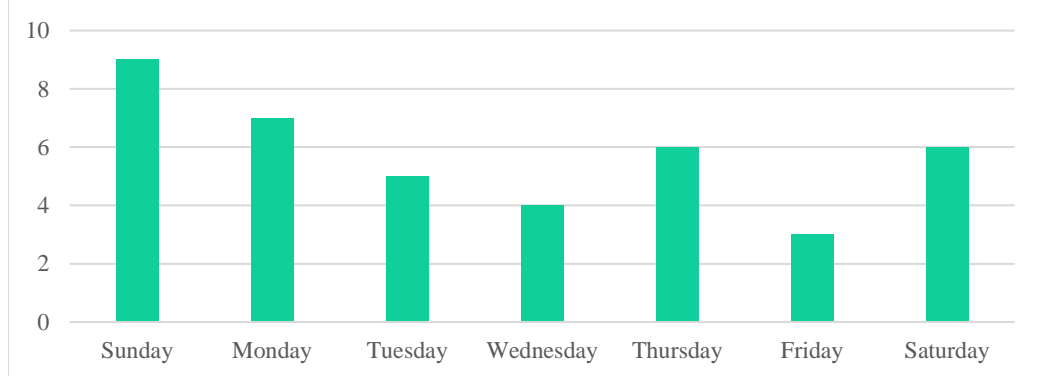

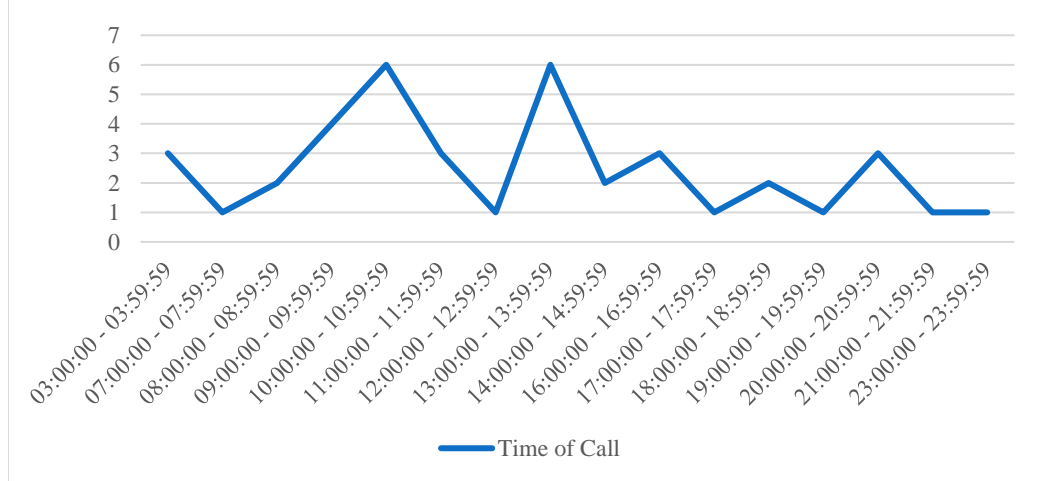

We have finish vaccinating all first responders in Knox County that wanted it. We could not do this without the partnership that we have with Rockland Fire & EMS and Chief Whytock along with the other EMS originations in the county. As vaccination continues, we are talking about how we can help with getting out to the rest of Knox County and to continue work with our partners, as this is a huge under taken. With the new CDC guidelines and people being vaccinated we now can hold trainings in person with some restrictions and plan to do so at the end of March

As you remember I ask to put in for the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) for a second rescue, I have completed and submitted the grant and know just waiting on the results. It will not be until end of April beginning of May before we start to find out. As you remember the reason for this second rescue is to help us answer second calls or when the first rescue is down for service or if worse it breaks down, we are not waiting 20 plus minutes for mutual aid to come and transport the patient. I also have submitted a grant for a CPR device, that with help us perform chest compressions on a patient in cardiac arrest. We are not getting the responders like we used to get to help with chest compressions.

We continue to be slightly busy more then last year, we are finally at a points were we have enough PPE for responders and things for dealing with COVID are looking up. As always the data the is listed about comes from our reporting software that is owned and maintained by the State of Maine called MEFIRS.
