The month of June brought us various weather patterns. We experienced mostly seasonal temperatures during the beginning of the month. However, the second half of the month was a different story. We were hit with a heat wave where the temperatures were well into the 90's, followed by a weekend of rain and thunderstorms. Nevertheless, we are here to serve you and that's exactly what we do.

Over the course of this month the crew has performed cross culverts, driveway culverts, ditching, and shouldering. We have also been busy mowing and trimming our cemeteries as well as the Common, Town Office, ball courts, and baseball field. We take great pride in our appearance in town, and I am proud of the efforts put forth by this crew to keep our grounds and roads maintained.

Since the beginning of June, we have replaced culverts on Beote Road, North Union Road, and Carroll Road. Once the Beote Road cross culverts were replaced we performed some minor ditching and graded the length of the road, adding gravel in the low spots in the process. Carroll Road and North Union Road also received some ditching and shouldering as well. On May 25th we moved our machine to Middle Road and replaced one driveway culvert. This is the beginning of a lengthy project for Middle Road as there are several cross culverts and driveway culverts in need of replacement.

Other tasks completed this month include line striping on 12.6 miles of town roadway performed by Finline Pavement Striping. We also completed in-house CDL training, time out for training at the Highway Congress in Skowhegan, line striping at the Town Office, and some minor washout repairs.
